Dunamase College/Coláiste Dhún Másc Mobile Phone and Digital Devise Policy:

This Mobile Phone Policy should be read in conjunction with the Code of Behaviour Policy. It is also subject to updates and guidance issued by the Department of Education.

## Rationale:

It is important that the new technologies developed and used in our school are used appropriately and that they are not used to compromise the learning environment in any way. Therefore, the school authorities adopt the following policy:

- The use of mobile phones/electronic music devices is prohibited in the school building/campus at all times. Where a student brings a mobile phone to school, it must be switched off and kept in a locker/or safe place during school times. It may not be used for any purpose in the school. If parents need to contact their child, they may do so through the school office at <a href="info@dunamasecollege.ie">info@dunamasecollege.ie</a> or on (057)8664696. Students who need to contact home, may do so by asking their year head, deputy principal, or the secretary to make a phone call for them.
- Students in contravention of the above, will have the phone including the sim card, confiscated and returned to the student after school and will complete a Friday after school detention. On the second time a student uses a mobile phone, the phone will only be returned to the parent at the end of that school day. If the parent cannot collect the phone, on the first instance, the phone will be returned but other

sanctions will apply. If the issue persists it will be considered a serious breach of the Code of Behaviour and further sanctions will apply and will no longer have the privilege of bringing their phone to school.

- Where a recurring breach of the policy occurs, it will be dealt with under the Code of Behaviour. Additional sanctions will ensue.
- There have been a number of incidences in Irish schools where mobile phones and
  electronic music devices have been used to bully students and/or undermine
  teachers. It should be noted that it is a criminal offence to use a mobile phone to
  menace, harass or offend another person. As such, the school may consider it
  appropriate to involve the Gardaí in such incidents.
- Any inappropriate texting/tweeting or communications between or about members of the school community is forbidden at any time.
- The school accepts no responsibility for replacing lost, stolen or damaged mobile
  phones or any digital devices. The safety and security of mobile phones is wholly a
  matter for students/parents/guardians. We would encourage students to leave their
  phones at home.
- Mobile phones cannot under any circumstances be taken into examination centres, including in house and end of term examinations. Breach of this rule may lead to invalidation of that examination and potentially other examinations.
- In the case of trips, visits and other off site activities, their use is only allowed under the supervision and agreement of the teachers in charge.
- Any unauthorised or inappropriate audio, visual or digital recording of staff/students
  of Dunamase College/Coláiste Dhún Másc on any device in any capacity is strictly
  prohibited. Violation of these policies by any student is a serious offence and an
  appropriate sanction will be administered. Note: This policy applies to any similar
  electronic devise to the two specified above e.g. Ipads, smart watches, laptops etc.
